

How to use LinkedIn to job hunt

5. Use #opentowork

You can enable the #opentowork feature from your LinkedIn profile. You can choose whether all LinkedIn members or only recruiters can see that you are open to job opportunities and LinkedIn will add an #opentowork photo frame to your profile photo.

6. Build your network

Build your 1st degree connections as this will exponentially increase your exposure & access to other connections.

7. Follow companies

Follow the companies you are interested in working for & you'll be kept updated on company news & new positions that become available.

8. Join groups, comment & interact

Join & contribute to groups related to your industry and post comments, your opinions to posts which interest you and are visible to company owners, managers & recruiters in your desired industry – get yourself seen (for all the right reasons of course).

9. Research

Before going for an interview, you can use LinkedIn to research hiring managers & interviewers to find out as much as you can about them and the company. Remember, knowledge is power.

10. Use LinkedIn's job search function

Last but by no means least, don't forget there are loads of jobs listed on LinkedIn. You can search these & also sign up to job alerts, so you are the first to know about new job opportunities as soon as they get posted.
